He highlighted the 30th Anniversary of ICA was being celebrated at this General Assembly and during the following 8th Rectors and Deans Forum **High Tech to Feed the World Sustainably: innovation from Spade to Fork**. He thanked Rector Arthur Mol for hosting the Forum at Wageningen University and Research. He highlighted that Dr Christian Patermann would address the delegates at the Forum dinner on the future role of life science universities. We had also asked past Presidents to give their challenges for the future of ICA in meeting the expectations of our members, and Marek Szyndel reported on their challenges. Marek Szyndel also highlighted the activities of the Board's sub-committees, ICA-Bio and ICA-Edu.

5 Report of ICA-Bioeconomy Committee of the ICA Board

The main activity in 2018 had been to organise with UNESCO a workshop International Cooperation in Education and Training for the Bioeocnomy at the Global Bioeconomy Summit in April in Berlin. A report of that Workshop was distributed at the General Assembly and is available from the ICA Secretariat. There is ongoing discussion to develop a European/International Bioeconomy Education Platform. ICA is a partner in a Cost application Education for the Bioeconomy, we participated in European Congress Lodz where we co-organised a workshop Bioeconomy Education for the future, and we were a partner in a BBI Horizon 2020 call Skils4Bio Current and future Skills development for a sustainable European Bioeconomy. Josef Gloessl reported he had also engaged in on ongoing discussion with John Bell and Waldemar Kutt from DG Research and Innovation.

Yvan Larondelle presented his report of the Accounts and Treasurer's Report of the accounts for 2017, the budget for 2019 and an overview of the expenses to date. There was a surplus on the I&E account at the 31 December 2017 of 3892€. The Total secure assets at 31 December stood at 101.388€ after allowing for insecure assets of

26.912€. The total secure assets was similar to that at the end of 2016, 101.107€. Although the GA in 2016 had agreed the withdrawal of 15.000€ for special projects 2017 there had been no need to withdraw such funds - ICA-Edu had been funded out of current income. The proposed Budget for 2019 was similar to the Budget for 2018 with the proposal to withdraw funds from the reserves of 15.000€ to support the work of the two Board Committees, ICA-Edu and ICA-Bio, with 4500€ each, and to allocate 6000€ to the development of the secretariat during the change-over of the Secretary General. On being questioned Yvan Larondelle confirmed that this allocation for the Secretariat was only envisage for a period of two years and not an ongoing charge. Yvan Larondelle reported on the financial status at 5 October. Unfortunately, ICA had had to return 15.000€ to the coordinator of the ELFRUS project in which ICA had been a partner. The Coordinator had misread the rules for the involvement of ICA and the payment to ICA had been rejected by the EU. The General Assembly approved the Accounts and Treasurer's Report for 2017, the Budget for 2019 and for the possibility to withdraw 15.000€ from reserves during the year 2019 for the projects as indicated above. 8 Membership subscription rates 2019 for approval Yvan Larondelle proposed that there would be no increase in the membership subscriptions rates for 2019.
