

How-question behind entrepreneurship education

Effectuation theory (Sarasvathy, 2001)

Effectuation versus causation

Education characterized by...

- Process of opportunity identification, evaluation and exploration
- Uncertainty
- Experimenting
- Risk-taking
- Learning-by-doing

Stimulating entrepreneurial mindset & embracing learning surprises



Three conditions EE Programs where...

... students can go through the entrepreneurial process of creating **opportunities**, evaluating opportunities and taking action – in non-linear form.

... **authentic** tasks are central and several outcomes are possible.

... students design an **artefact** that is valuable to someone else.

Teacher workshop: goals



Contents, methods and activities that support the development of **motivation**, **skills** and **experience**, which make it possible to be **entrepreneurial**, to manage and participate in **value-creating processes**.
